There will also be a "Sweatshirt Day" to show off our favorite winter attire and much more.

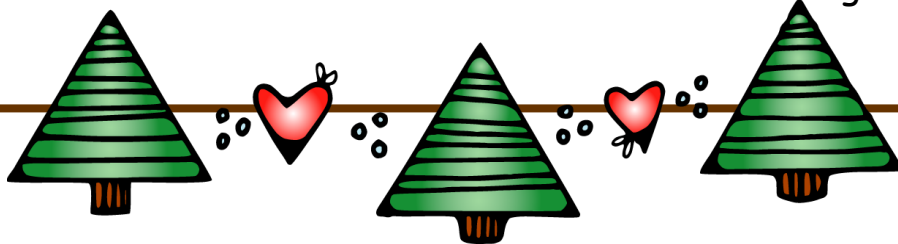
Be sure to read through the informational sections of the newsletter and as always, post your calendars someplace handy.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Please check with the office and confirm your contact phone numbers. With the weather being unpredictable, it is important that we can reach you in case of an emergency. Remember that if your office, home, or cell phone number has changed, you need to let the office know as soon as possible. If you aren't sure what numbers we have, please ask!

Don't forget to clock your student in and out each day on the school computer! Remember that you must tap the button with your student's name before hitting "Finish" for a time to be logged. At the end of each day, a staff member must manually put in times for anyone who has not successfully logged their student in or out. We do our best to remember your arrival and/or departure times. The only way to guarantee that you will not be overcharged for your actual attendance is to clock in and out each day.

Also, the Department of Children, Youth and Family Services requires that an authorized person must physically sign a student in and out each day using a full signature. Please remember to do this when picking up and/or dropping off. This is in addition to using the computer.

You can request additional gingerbread people from Mrs. Ehlers if you would like one for each family member to disguise.

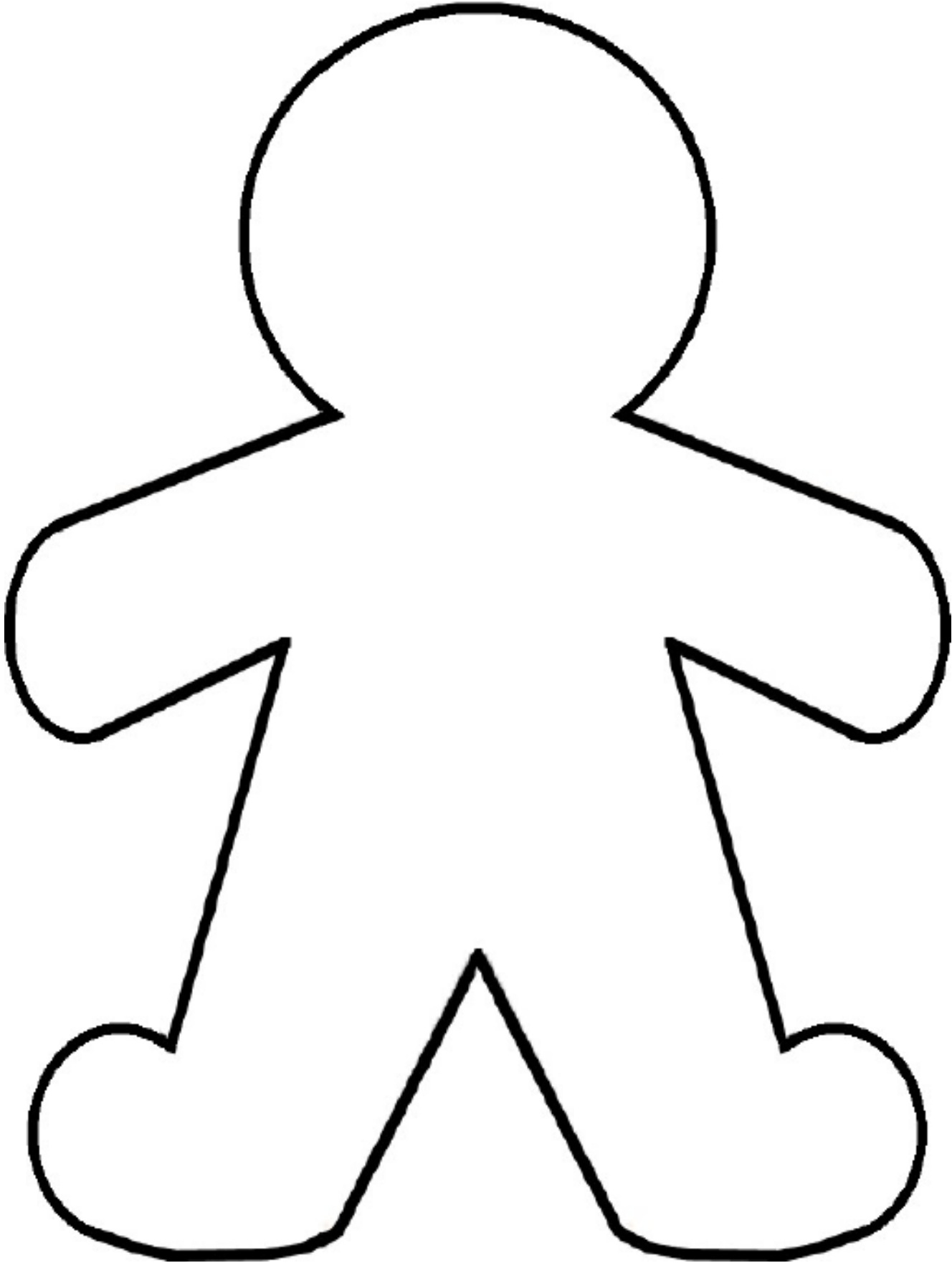

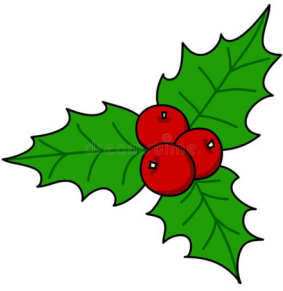
Work as a family on this project with your child.

a family Gingerbread Exchange!**

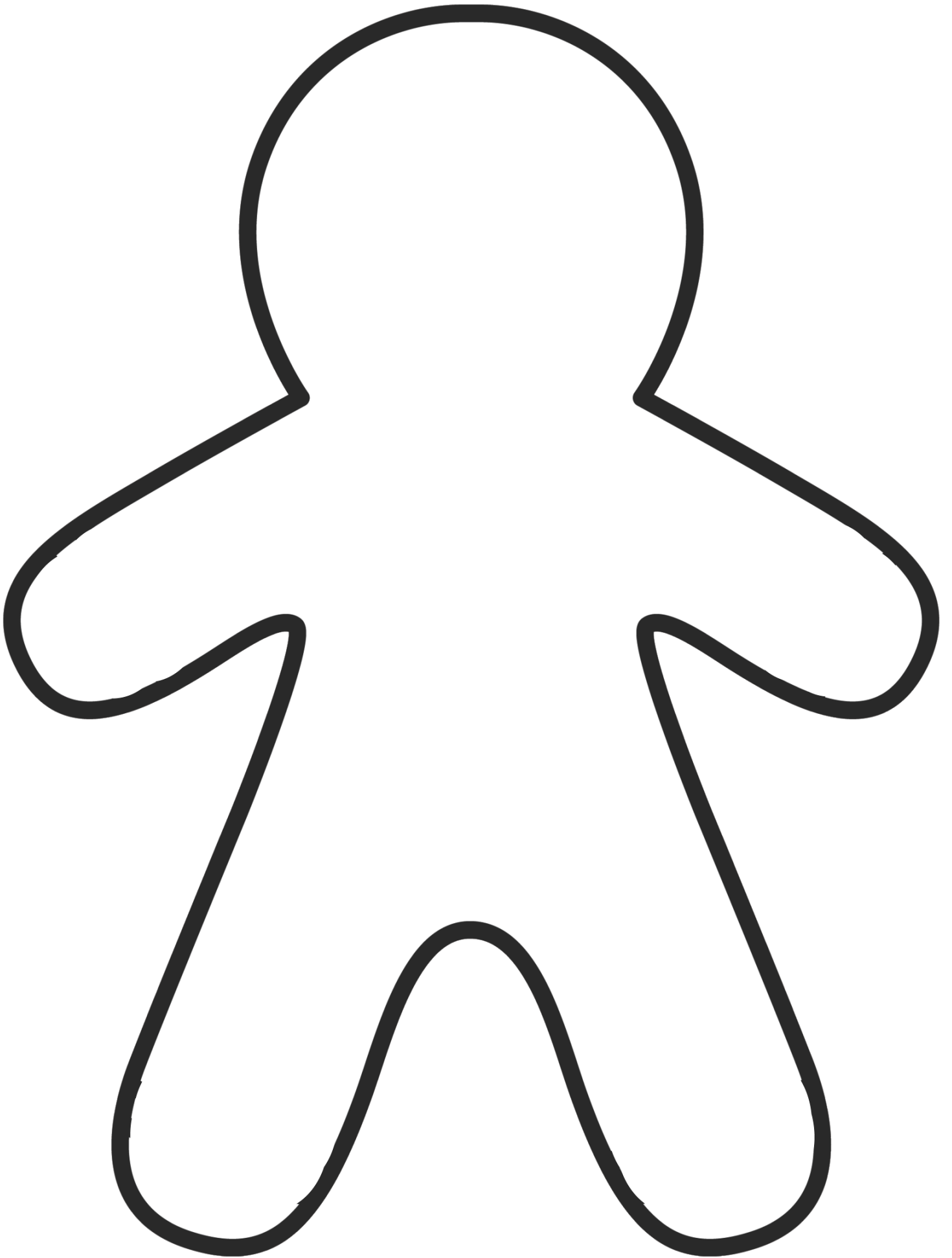

Here's how it will work:

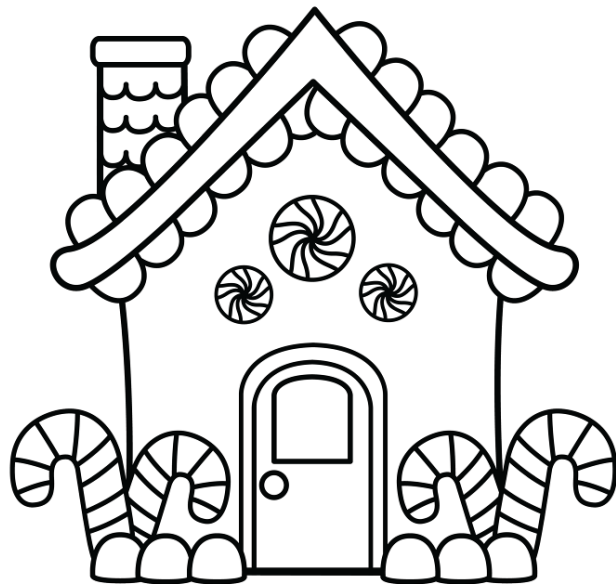

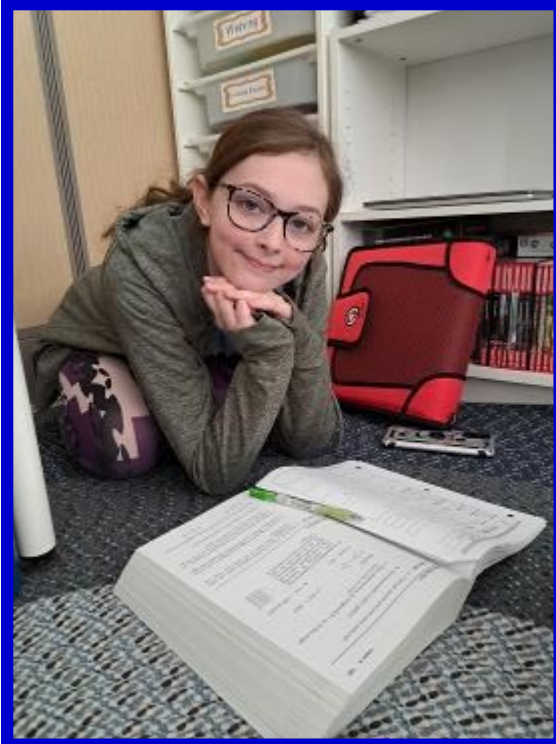

Character Building Classes

Character Traits are qualities or characteristics of a person or character. Character traits describe what a person is like on the inside. We can determine a person's character traits by their actions, thoughts, and words.

Our Character Building Classes this month will include the topic of **Gratefulness**.

People who are grateful truly appreciate and are thankful for things and people in their lives. Sometimes grateful people are even thankful for the challenges and difficulties they face because of the lessons they might learn in those hard situations.

The following are some questions your student will ask him/herself while at school during the month of December: *Do you exhibit this character trait regularly in your own life? *Would you like to exhibit this character trait more or less? *Do you think gratitude is a desirable character trait? *How does being grateful impact a person's own life?

Interesting Fact:

Research indicates that expressing gratitude has a positive impact on children and adults. Showing gratitude has been shown to increase optimism and positive emotions, as well as making people feel more connected and satisfied with school.

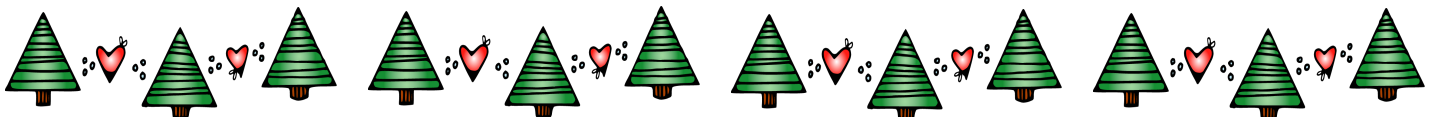
Please encourage your student to start a gratitude journal.
