

Please have your student find <u>one</u> very special item of interest for him/her to put in the brown bag that will come home in the parent information files. It will be



### Character Building Classes

Character Traits are qualities or characteristics of a person or character. Character traits describe what a person is like on the inside. We can determine a person's character traits by their actions, thoughts, and words.

Our Character Building Classes this month will include the topic of Fairness.

Fairness, according to Merriam-Webster's Dictionary, is "marked by impartiality and honesty, conforming with the established rules." As a concept, fairness is especially challenging for young children to understand. With other traits, like kindness or responsibility, there are concrete actions to observe which may provide a basic understanding of the concept itself. However, fairness is found in the way we treat one another, the way in which we play a game, the way in which live life, etc. One good way to teach children fairness is through play.

1. <u>Practice Taking Turns</u>: Taking turns gives opportunity to explain the abstract concepts of fairness. The guided conversation can be one of the best ways to teach your child all about fairness - not only that, but to see the positive results when fairness is applied.

2. <u>Model the Rules</u>. For older children, use games as and opportunity to model and explain why we play by a given set of rules, how we take turns and encourage one another even when we are unhappy with the outcome. An Important Key is to "Lead by Example".

3. <u>Notice Fair and Unfair</u>: Draw attention to behaviors in books, movies, and in life when others are acting in a fair or unfair manner. Ask your child questions like "What is another way he could have acted to make things fair?" or "How did she show fairness to the other person?"

4. <u>Praise Fairness</u>: Take a moment to recognize and verbalize when your child is acting out of fairness. Helping him to notice fairness in his own behaviors will help him to grow in his understanding of the concept.

5. <u>Encourage Empathy</u>. This suggestion is one that does not deal directly with fairness, but rather provides your child with motivation to be fair. Teach your children empathy. Make sure that they know the inherent value of a human being, that they realize that every other person they encounter has an inner life as rich and detailed - and sometimes hurt - as their own. When your child learns to begin thinking outside of their own wants, fairness flourishes.

Understanding fairness requires that your child sees the big picture, that they understand the effects they have on the lives of others. When they begin to understand the place of fairness in their own personal lives, as well as in society as a whole, they'll be better able to make a positive impact on a world that sorely needs it.

Creating a fairer world begins with you and what you teach your children—after all, it will be their world one day. Do your best to make it a good one for all of its inhabitants.
