

Please follow the directions below:

1.Cut out the center of a large margarine lid so only the ring remains.

2. Tie one end of the yarn to the ring. Tape or glue the yarn to the edge of the lid.

3.Loop the yarn tightly and evenly around the ring, as shown in the diagram below, until you return to the first loop.

4.Loop the yarn strand under and through the first set of loops to create a second row.

As you pull the string tightly, yarn "triangles" will begin to form.

5.Continue adding rows of loops moving towards the center of the ring.6.When you reach the center of the web, knot the yarn, cut it off and glue or tape it in place.


7.Glue a plastic spider to the center knot if you wish.


8. You can make as many spider webs as you would like.





## CMS Sick Policy—Parent Handbook

Children who come to school not feeling well become more vulnerable to infection. Also, being in a school setting, germs have the potential to spread quickly because of increased and frequent contact with other children. In an effort to establish a healthier environment for all the children it is requested that all sick children are cared for at home.


If you child has had any symptoms of illness during the night, such as nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or fever, please keep him/her home until their temperature has returned to normal for 24 hours and the symptoms have gone.

When a student is absent from school, it will be the parent or guardian's responsibility to telephone the school office no later than 4:00am each day of the student's absence. It is particularly important that you inform the school office if your child has contracted any communicable diseases as we are required to notify other families in the school when their children may have been exposed.

If your child should become ill at school, he/she will be isolated and you or an authorized person listed on the emergency form will be notified immediately in order to pick up your child. We will not call you unless you are really needed.

- After a fever, the student must have a normal temperature of (98.6) for  $\underline{24}$  hours before he/she may return to school without the aid of medication.
- If a student is well enough to come to school, we will expect him/her to go outdoors with his/her class and participate in all activities.
- Often students will ask to come to school even though they are ill. Although your student may be disappointed, please keep him/her home if he/she is sick.
- If your student becomes ill while at school and you are called, please cooperate by picking your student up promptly.
